

Patient Care Advancement Initiative 10/01/2021

Members of Budget Committee,

Anderson County EMS has been steadily working on improving our clinical capabilities and increasing our skills and capabilities in the field. Assistant Director Scott Thomas has developed a Critical Care program that we are so very close to launching, and is in the process of defining a Mobile Integrated Healthcare program. Both of these advancements greatly improve our patient care capabilities, and will be a great service we can provide the citizens, and visitors, to Anderson County. We are asking for your consideration to approve EMS to use funds we have to make these purchases and move forward.

Below is a brief description of each item we are looking to purchase:

- 1. AirTraq Video Laryngoscopes and Blades Total \$8200
 - a. Video Camera Attachment 6 at \$775.00 \$4650
 - b. Replacement Blades 40 pg at \$80 each \$3200 (10pg each size w/ 2 blades per pg)
 - c. Training Blades 2 sizes at \$158 ea (\$316)
- *Improve success rates of first-time intubations for patients with small or damaged airways. Endotracheal intubation is gold standard for patients with respiratory failure, cardiac arrest, or significant trauma that needs surgical intervention.
 - 2. Ventilator to replace current aging one. Total \$30,000
 - a. Zoll EMV+ or Zoll Z \$15000 each. Would like 2 to have ability to rotate or use if multiple SCT transports happen.
- *Replacing outdated ventilator with one that is easier to use, provides more capabilities, and up to date software will allow Critical Care Paramedics to transport vent dependent patients to other hospitals for further specialty care without having to wait on outside organizations or air-medical, which will result in decreased financial cost to insurance companies and patients.
 - 3. EPOC Blood Analysis System for the MIH Program, would like 2 systems.
 - a. EPOC Device \$8000 ea
 - b. Wireless Printer \$750 ea
 - c. Data Manager Software \$750 (only need to purchase 1 time)
 - d. Test Cartridges \$250 per box with 25 per box
- *Give Community Paramedics the ability to draw and test on site at a patient's home, providing the referring physician access to 23 different lab values. This will allow patients who have transportation issues or that need post discharge follow up to have blood work without having to travel or wait for lab/Dr appointments.
 - 4. Auto-compression Devices Total \$136,000
 - a. Lucas 3.1 device 8 at \$17,000 each
- *Improved outcomes with device in all settings. Especially important in rural settings where additional first responders may be delayed or short staffed. Frees up the EMS crew to perform other vital tasks necessary for resuscitation efforts.





- Autovents Hands free BVM Total \$66,400 not including tubing.
 - a. Parapac + 8 at \$8300 each
- *Similar in concept to the Lucas, but used to free up EMS crew after PT is intubated so that ventilations given are equal, properly times, and consistent.
 - 6. IV Pumps increase ability to provide better medications to patients Total \$6,300
 - a. Nimbus II EMS IV Pump 7 at \$900 which includes startup of admin sets and IV pole clamp.
- *Allows EMS to provide better control of medications that need specific micro-doses or medications that need to be given over time. Also allows EMS to add new medications that require IV pumps, which have been shown to improve outcomes for patients.
 - 7. Butterfly iQ+ Ultrasound Device Total \$7998 for 2. Would be for the MIH Program.
- *Another Point of Care device to aid in the evaluation of homebound patients, or those with transportation issues, that need post-discharge follow up for the referring physician.
- **If enough devices are obtained for 911 system trucks, this has proven application pre-hospital to determine extent of soft tissue trauma to the abdomen for better routing of patients at the hospital. Also been shown to aid in the finding of hemorrhagic vs occlusive strokes, and can aid in the placement of difficult IVs. All of this is to provide better care for patients in the pre-hospital setting.

I have attached a couple of important pages from a new release from TDEC regarding additional funding opportunities for water, wastewater, stormwater infrastructure.

Randy Walters has attended one briefing, and I will be meeting with fellow mayors and TDEC later in October to learn more about this program and can report back in November.

Each county will receive a base allocation. In addition, TDEC will be opening up a competitive granting program for remaining funds. TDEC and the Tennessee Association of Utility Districts are collaborating to support completion of TN Infrastructure Scorecards for each water, wastewater, and stormwater system across the state. These scorecards will be invaluable to County Commission in determining which projects you might choose to financially match from Anderson County's own American Rescue Plan fund allocation.

In addition, I would recommend supporting investment in planning documents that could not only serve to benefit the future operation and development of systems within Anderson County, but also serve as decision-making tools in your hands as the Legislative Body charged with recommendation and approval of expenditure of these funds.

Tennessee American Rescue Plan Water Infrastructure Non-Competitive Grants

Program Summary (DRAFT)

Addressing Tennessee's drinking water, wastewater, and stormwater infrastructure is a critical need.¹ Reports produced by various sources cite necessary investment in Tennessee water infrastructure ranging from \$5 to 15 billion dollars between now and 2040.²

Tennessee's communities and economy rely on access to clean, reliable, and abundant water resources and services. Water makes Tennessee thrive and supports many significant activities, such as:

- Drinking water and sewer services for residents and businesses,
- Agriculture,
- Major industrial operations,
- · Transportation of goods on navigable waters, and
- Recreational activities on lakes, rivers, and streams.

A massive level of investment is critical to reliably supply our state with water resources amidst rapid economic and population growth.

The following summary is in draft form and will be adjusted upon release of the US Department of Treasury's Final Rule to ensure compliance. In mid-September TDEC will also release an investment plan for review and public comment.

Overview

- In August 2021, Tennessee's Financial Stimulus Accountability Group (FSAG) dedicated \$1.35 billion
 of Tennessee's Fiscal Recovery Funds from the American Rescue Plan (ARP) to water, wastewater,
 and stormwater infrastructure projects. In September 2021, the US Treasury will release the Final
 Rule on eligible uses of the funds.
- The Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation (TDEC) will award approximately \$1 billion in the form of non-competitive grants to communities for eligible water, wastewater, and stormwater infrastructure projects as part of the Tennessee ARP Water Infrastructure Investment Program. This summary pertains to these grants only. Roughly \$350 million will be allocated towards state-initiated priority projects. During a later phase of this program, TDEC will launch a competitive granting program using any remaining funds.

¹ Throughout this document the phrases "water infrastructure" and "drinking water, wastewater, and stormwater infrastructure" are used interchangeably.

² One such report is the Tennessee Advisory Commission on Intergovernmental Relations report, <u>Building Tennessee's Tomorrow: Anticipating the State's Infrastructure Needs – July 2018 through June 2023</u>. See Table D-18 Water and Wastewater Needs by County, July 2018 – June 2023 for a 5-year listing of self-reported needs.

• TDEC and the Tennessee Association of Utility Districts (TAUD) are collaborating to support completion of TN Infrastructure Scorecards for each water, wastewater, and stormwater system across the state. This effort, expected to commence in November 2021, is a foundational step in understanding the environmental, operational, and financial health of each system and identifying opportunities for deploying ARP dollars towards system enhancement through eligible water, wastewater, and stormwater projects.

Eligible Sub-Recipients & Allocations

- With these non-competitive grants, TDEC is targeting enhancements among community public drinking water systems, wastewater systems with a component of municipal or domestic wastewater (e.g., wastewater treatment plants, collection systems, and decentralized treatment systems), and stormwater management systems serving the public.⁴
- TDEC will use a non-competitive and formula-based approach to identify allocations and has
 determined that it will offer funds directly to county governments. As a non-competitive granting
 program, application is by invitation only.
 - TDEC will provide county governments the opportunity to accept their grant allocation, with the expectation that counties will coordinate with water and wastewater utilities and stormwater systems serving customers in their county to identify potential projects for proposed use of funding. More details regarding requirements associated with this funding are provided in subsequent sections.
 - Any declined and remaining monies will be re-programmed to support innovative water infrastructure projects through state strategic priorities and/or a competitive granting program at a later date.
 - o TDEC and its partners strongly encourage counties and water and wastewater utilities and stormwater systems to take advantage of this significant opportunity.
- Each county will be eligible to receive a base allocation plus a portion of monies determined based on county population. The formula that will be used follows.

County Allocation = \$2,105,263 + [\$800,000,015 * (County Population / Tennessee Population)]

TDEC will publish proposed allocations for each county in mid-September as part of its draft investment plan. In summary, this approach sets aside \$200 million for equal distribution among each of Tennessee's 95 counties, providing each county a base allocation of \$2,105,263. The remaining funds set aside for non-competitive grants, approximately \$800 million, will be distributed to each county proportional to their population in addition to their base allocation.

³ The TN Infrastructure Scorecard is distinct from the ASCE Infrastructure Scorecard. TDEC and TAUD are currently developing a version 2.0, which will be available in November 2021.

⁴ TDEC is not targeting systems operating for the primary purpose of supporting commercial/ industrial operations with this offering.

Dear Mayor Frank and Anderson County Commissioners,

As you know, the Child Advocacy Center of Anderson County Tennessee, Inc. provides unique trauma informed forensic services for our county's abused and neglected children. These services, bringing "healing and justice for abused children" (our mission), have been ongoing throughout the Covid-19 pandemic.

As a 501 c 3 non-profit organization, we request funds from the **American Rescue Plan** to improve the Child Advocacy Center's ability to provide a healthy childhood environment for the children we serve as Covid-19 continues and beyond.

The current Covid-19 pandemic has challenged our capacity to provide ongoing services as safely as possible for the children referred. We lack sufficient natural ventilation due to the current aging and inefficient aluminum windows. Difficult to use, the windows have ill-fitting (or missing) screens and need replacement.

New, properly fitted windows will allow us to open windows to increase the delivery of clean outdoor air. This will increase clean interior air while diluting potential contaminants, such as the COVID-19 virus. Window replacement will provide a healthier childhood environment for the children.

At this time, we are getting estimates on window replacement, and expect the project to cost approximately \$14,000. This one-time expense will not need ongoing maintenance. We believe this to be an allowable use of the ARP funds.

If more information is needed to make a determination, please contact me, or one of the CAC Board of Directors I have copied.
