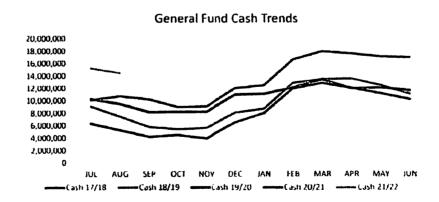

RE: Firetruck Resolution

Dear Chairman Vowell and Honorable Members of Budget Committee,

I wish to request that Budget Committee give serious consideration to a bulk purchase of fire trucks based on the same expectations for mutual aid considerations as part of the existing Fire Truck Resolution No. 15-7-545.

Currently there are a several larger issues at stake:

- 1. Current county allocation is being split into two budget years and even though the Fire Truck resolution built in an annual 2.5% cost of inflation, the current county allocation is drastically lower than the current actual cost of a new fire truck. This funding gap between what we're allocating for the purchase and what each department actually has to pay for a new truck has been a topic of concern raised by Budget Committee:
- 2. Non-COVID world averages are approximately 3% a year, but COVID impacts have greatly increased cost of materials. (For purposes of the attached spreadsheet, the inflation rate of 5% is used.)
- 3. Fire Commission and County Commission have indicated a desire to maintain the Fire Truck Resolution.

Based on the three key points above, I wish to humbly recommend County Commission proceed with a bulk purchase of fire trucks split into 2 budget years for the following reasons:

- Bulk purchase generates a considerable discount for purchase price. For instance, as an example from Pierce, a single new truck with no discounts would be \$359,616.23. Bulk purchase of 10 or more (within two budget years) would be \$319,229 per truck. (Bulk purchase over three years would be \$346,334 higher, thus my recommendation for splitting into 2 years)
- -2. Bulk purchase has a direct community impact by putting 10 new vehicles in service within two-years, boosting impact for ISO ratings.

3. Bulk purchase addresses the next 10 year cycle, but generates additional savings by avoiding annual inflationary pressures and future unknowns in material supply costs.

Other Options:

- 1. If Budget Committee does not agree with allocating the full bulk cost split into two budget years, a possible option is to allocate half and borrow/finance half. In speaking with the county's financial advisor Cumberland Securities, we can estimate 1% for a 5 year note (though he did say he just was able to borrow at .85% for one county recently). Even with interest, avoiding the annual allocation plan generates well over a million dollars in avoided cost to the fire truck program over 10 years.
- 2. The difference between one unit at \$359,616 and a 10 vehicle bulk price of \$319,229 is \$40,387 per truck. Because of the steep discount involved in a bulk purchase, this program creates a genuine one-of-a-kind opportunity to purchase an additional truck to stand up an on-call shared response vehicle for all agencies. This would mean purchasing 11 trucks.

In terms of allocating tax dollars, assigning those dollars to investments that improve ISO ratings yields savings to homeowners that are real and tangible.

This 10 Bulk Purchase is based on the existing Fire Truck Resolution beginning with the current status of Andersonville as next up for funding:

- 1. Andersonville Volunteer Fire Department
- 2. Briceville Volunteer Fire Department
- 3. Oliver Springs Fire Department
- 4. Clinton Fire Department
- 5. Rocky Top Fire Department
- 6. Norris Volunteer Fire Department
- 7. Claxton Volunteer Fire Department
- 8. Marlow Volunteer Fire Department
- 9. Oak Ridge Fire Department
- 10. Medford Volunteer Fire Department
 OPTION: County Wide Back Up Response added as 11th vehicle

11th year would be Rescue Squad as their purchase is currently finalizing. As Rescue Squad does not purchase a fire engine, their allocation could be handled differently by Anderson County. Or, we could inquire if bulk pricing would apply for a vehicle they might need and include it in this bulk purchase.

**For purposes of this discussion, I contacted Pierce. Their pricing is based on full warranty of 5 years; the pricing covers cost of a new commercial pumper or tanker—whatever the department needs. Pierce indicated the industry is expecting double digit price increases over the next several years.

Attached you will find a packet of information pertaining to a X-Ray machine we are wanting procure for the detention facility. Our region is facing unprecedented overdoses due to the use of heroin, fentanyl, and/or combining both. As you know, regrettably, the war on drugs has entered detention facilities and prisons across the area. I don't want to get too involved in this email as I plan on sharing this information today, but I wanted to give a few highlights that go along with our conversation.

- 32 overdoses in past 12 months (majority have come in last 4 months)
- To date, we have been billed \$130,486.50 for medical services rendered for overdoses
- Of the 32, 4 patients billing have not been processed yet by the hospital
- 5 inmates had private insurance that paid for their services
- Based on the previous 4 overdoses, I anticipate owing approximately \$80-90K for those alone
- Area jails have moved to an x-ray scanning machine for all inmates entering the jail
- This item, I believe is COVID money approved, as this will limit contact with inmates via pat downs and searches.
- X-Ray machine we would like is \$149,000 which includes extensive training by the vendor
- We can scan one inmate up to 1,000 times per year per the National Council on Radiation Protection and Measurements

Mr. Chairman, the highlights do not paint the entire picture as to why this is so important for our facility and county as a whole. I look forward to sharing this information with you and the members of the committee.

*FUNDS

Tek 84 anticipates a second wave of Cares funds. The Intercept is \$149,000 and this includes 2 years of warranty, installation and training.

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Intercept is a true breakthrough in this technology. Only 34" wide, it ships fully assembled and rolls to the final site through standard doorways. Unlike other systems that move the subject horizontally on a platform or conveyor belt, each subject enters the scanner and stands motionless for 4 seconds.

Intercept provides a high-resolution scan of the full body, including the abdomen, in a single image. Other body scanners require two views for full coverage. Intercept complies with the ANSI N43-17 Federal standard for both General-Use (daily screening) and Limited-Use (weekly screening).

In the first couple of months of 2021, we documented 11 incidents involving drugs, needles, lighters, metal items, and other contraband beyond the search trap and incarcerated 8 inmates with introduction charges.

I have spoken with Captain Emert with the Roane County Sheriff's Department, who has begun using this system. He stated he thinks this system is a very good tool to have. He stated they have been able to find lots of contraband in the booking area alone. He is now under the impression that the machine has almost halted the flow of contraband. He believes inmates have come to the realization that they will be caught so they don't bring it in. He further stated the machine is easy to use and the company is very efficient on training. He also said there is no continuing education for this technology. The company comes to your facility to conduct the training then will leave a power point for you to train your department in the future.

The Intercept is \$149,000 and this includes 2 years of warranty, installation and training. The Intercept also has a thermal scanner option for an additional \$20,000.

The only American made body scanner has been purchased by Sumner, Blount, Dyer, Roane, and Hamilton County Sheriffs for the detention facilities. Tek 84's 200th system was sold in less than 2 years and this is unprecedented in this industry. The number is now over 230.

Over the past few months, Tek 84 has seen a huge spike in orders from counties small and large using The Cares Act funds to promote social distancing, less touching during the intake process. The Intercept has an optional thermal sensor for taking temperature. (See attached graphic.) Tek 84 anticipates a second wave of Cares funds.

There are many legitimate reasons for the success of this unique and patented scanner. (Please review the attachments that explain the design superiority.) Here is a summary of the features and benefits that differentiate this product from currently marketed older generation whole body scanners that are larger, foreign made, slower, and depend on a moving conveyor belt or platform to scan the subject.

- 1. The intercept does not require the subject to move on a platform or conveyor belt during the scanning process. (Better image and safer.)
- 2. The Intercept Scanner is the only scanner to have an ultra-compact footprint of 34" by 72". (See attached footprint template.)
- 3. The Intercept Scanner is transportable.

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- 4. The intercept Scanner is the only whole body scanner that can complete a scan in 4 seconds.
- 5. The Intercept was 100% designed, developed, engineered, and fully assembled in the United States. It also holds a US patent. Tek 84's HQ is in Poway, CA. This is the only American made body scanner.

The beam is always equidistant from the part of the body being scanned, not angled. And of course, the subject does not move. (Please refer to attachments.)

The Intercept Body Scanner comes pre-assembled in 2 crates. One crate for the scanner and one for the portable work station. (See attachments.)

- The Intercept can roll to a different location in the jail with the heavy duty casters. Then the stabilizer feet are dropped to the floor to provide a secure non-moving product.
- Because of the footprint (34" by 72") there is typically no need for the expense of building modifications to make room for the scanner.
- The pre-assembled scanner can roll through a 34.5" security door to the location the jail wants to utilize it. Our technician then just needs to do some key-stroking to set the system up.
- There is another important point about The Intercept and Tennessee. I have attached a section of The Federal ANSI standards that The State of Tennessee strictly enforces. The Intercept adheres to these standards. This scanner was specifically designed for the person being scanned to face away from the x-ray beam.

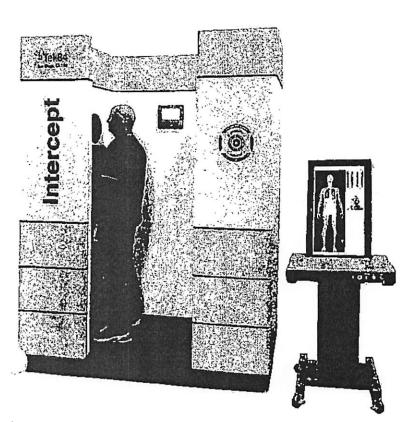

Additional, specific requirements for achieving the dose limits are included in Section 7.0, "System and Manufacturing Requirements," and Section 8.0, "Operating Requirements."

6.1 Dose to Scanned Individuals

The radiation dose delivered to a scanned individual shall be as low as reasonably achievable (ALARA) while meeting the required detection performance. When using transmission systems, to minimize the effective dose received, persons undergoing screening should be positioned facing away from the source of radiation.

The system manufacturer shall ensure that operating parameters are optimized for the best performance at the lowest dose.

6.1.1 Dose Limitation for General-use Systems

6.1.1.1 Class A (Full-body Scanner) For Class A (full-body) scanners the reference effective dose as determined according to

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Section 6.1.3, "Determination of the Reference Effective Dose," shall not exceed 0.25 µSv (25 µrem) per screening.

For Class A general-use systems, the reference effective dose received individuals from one facility shall not exceed 250 µSv (25 mrem) over a 12-month period. Compliance with this requirement shall be demonstrated as follows: if the nature of the screening operation is such that one or more adult individuals may be screened routinely more than twice each day of the year by the same facility (e.g., as in routine screening of employees), the facility shall keep records to show that either: 1) the number of screenings received by any individual does not exceed 1,000 per 12-month period or 2) the reference effective dose multiplied by the number of screenings does not exceed 250 µSv (25 mrem) over a 12-month period for any individual. Note: the reference effective dose is based on a computational adult model and is not always indicative of the actual effective dose, especially for small children. Therefore, practices that involve daily screening of the same population of children are not recommended without additional analysis.

Table 1 can be used to aid in meeting the annual dose requirement.
