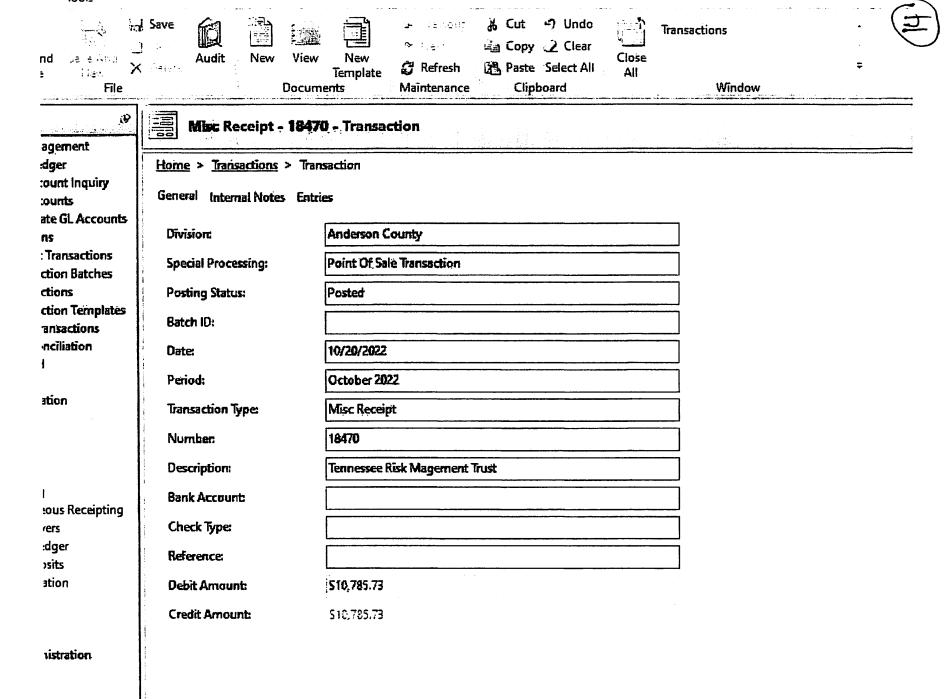

How did we get here?

Six years ago, a few citizens met with a state election attorney to begin the process of putting a Charter government on the ballot.

In 2016, these citizens secured the needed number of signatures on a petition, and the required election was held to elect 8 Charter Commissioners, one from each of the existing County Commission districts.

The Charter Commission held 50 public meetings at which 49 elected officials and county department heads described their work under the current constitutional framework.

None of these elected officials and department heads advocated for a Charter form of government.

No citizens appeared before the Charter Commission and endorsed a Charter form of government, and not one citizen appeared and spoke against the current form of government in use in Anderson County since 1801.

Seeing no interest from the citizens to change from the existing Constitutional form of government to a Charter form of government, the Charter Commission decided no further action was needed.

This decision resulted in a lawsuit against the Charter Commission. (DeVol and Stanley v. A.C. Charter Commission, Chancery Court No. 18CH555) The parties resolved the lawsuit and reached an understanding that the Charter Commission would resume meetings, write a Charter and submit that Charter to the citizens of Anderson County for approval.

The Charter Commission has now completed the proposed Charter and the decision to change the government structure in Anderson County will be decided by the voters on November 8th.

Advantages of the Anderson County Charter:

- Changes in government operations are controlled by the citizens through passage of referendums.
- Permits citizens to have a greater voice in local county government policies, and encourages more citizens to be involved in local government.
- Reduces state legislative interference in purely local county affairs.
- Citizens can recall unfaithful elected officials through the referendum process.
- Adoption of ordinances will allow the County Commission to pass penal ordinances with fines up to \$1,000 as opposed to the \$50 limit imposed on counties that follow the Constitutional form of government. The majority of fine revenues collected will be retained by the County, instead of sending those revenues to Nashville.
- Every six years a Charter Review Committee will meet to review governmental operations and make recommendations for improvement.
- Creates Enterprise Zones to provide economic stimulus incentives to areas in need of revitalization.
 Not allowed under current form of government.
- Broader local legislative powers.

What is a Charter Form of government?

The Tennessee Constitution provides for three forms of county government structure: (1) Constitutional, (2) Metropolitan and (3) Charter. Anderson County was formed in 1801 and has utilized the basic Constitutional form of government since the birth of our county.

Both the Metropolitan and Charter forms of government are optional under Tennessee law, but subject to approval from the voters of the county. The Metropolitan form of government is most often seen when a county and city merge government operations to become more efficient by eliminating duplication of governmental services. Moore, Trousdale and Davidson operate with consolidated Metropolitan forms of government.

A Charter form of government, adds considerable flexibility and broader government powers through the adoption of ordinances. Citizens have the right to call for referendums on matters of importance.

Shelby and Knox are the only two counties in Tennessee that have Charter forms of government. However, Charter forms of government are much more prevalent in Tennessee municipalities. If you are a resident of one of the municipalities inside Anderson County, chances are you are most likely familiar with the city or town charter and the ability to pass ordinances on a variety of topics.

Why a Charter form of government?

The basic premise under the Constitutional form of government is that counties have no authority except that expressly given to them by the statutes or necessarily implied from those laws created by the Tennessee General Assembly. Therefore, many powers that cities and towns have are not available to counties unless citizens approve by referendum a county Charter. If approved by the voters, a new form of government is authorized that can be more freely modified by the citizens through the referendum process, that can either place restrictive limits on, or enlarge governmental powers.

Disadvantages of a Charter form of government:

- Opponents of the Charter form of government often point to the fact that only two of Tennessee's 95 Counties have passed Charter forms of government (Knox and Shelby) and both have faced years of lawsuits, complications in government operations, and when combined with term limits through a future referendum, the counties have faced wholesale layoffs of the entire staff when the elected official is termed out of office. Citizens suffer with new administrations that lack experience in dealing with complex legal issues:
- Diminishes the welf-accepted representative form of government by bypassing elected county officials who are much more knowledgeable about local county affairs

than the average county citizen.

- Frequent changes in county government through repeated referendums and amendments may cause instability in government operations.
- Emergency amendments to the Charter for strictly "housekeeping" measures are very cumbersome and may take months if not years to pass, if turned down by the voters.
- •Referendum votes can only be scheduled every two years to coincide with county general elections, therefore, if all tax increases are restricted to referendum approval by the citizens, this process may limit the county's ability to deal with emergency revenue shortages and complex governmental issues that could deprive the county of needed tax revenues which could inevitably bankrupt the county.
- •Ballots could become excessive in length with multiple referendum and Charter amendment issues on the ballot causing citizens to get discouraged from voting, or casting a vote on referendum issues they know nothing about.
- •Increases the opportunity for politically motivated special interest groups to weaponize the referendum process.
- Crowded ballots with nonsensical amendments may create disinterested or discourage voters from casting votes, thus, allowing special interest groups the ability to easily sway and manipulate elections.

Chairman Vowell and Budget Committee members,

I want to thank each of you for considering the equipment request we presented at the October Budget Committee meeting. I want to apologize for some wrong information I shared and actually decrease our request. We are not ready to replace our cardiac monitors. While I was off on vacation my staff realized that I had the wrong purchase year for our monitors, and our monitors are good for eight years not seven (it is stretchers that have a life expectancy of seven years). I have attached a document from Stryker (the manufacturer for both the stretchers and the cardiac monitors) that gives a little more information. In the document it does say that cardiac monitors have a "five-year life expectancy" (page 1 under Age and use), our cardiac monitors were purchased in 2018 (not 2016 as I had noted). Although that places us at 2023 being year five, if you look at page 2 it states that "LIFEPAK monitor/defibrillators have an eight-year expected service life under normal conditions and with appropriate periodic maintenance."

We fall under the eight year time frame and have had preventative maintenance performed on this equipment every year since purchase. Again, I apologize for making this error and bringing a request to you that does not need to be considered until 2025/2026. I will be more diligent on these requests and will not make such an error again.

For the stretchers, I have attached a spreadsheet with a breakdown of our current fleet. We have seven stretchers from 2008 that are all currently out of service (two are still being used for decedent transports as we have no fully operational stretchers available for that). We have two from 2013 that are currently out of service. We have seven ambulances that do not currently have a stretcher in them. We are asking for 12 stretchers, this affords us the ability to place a new stretcher on every front line ambulance, place older stretchers on every reserve ambulance, place two older stretchers on the body transport vehicle, and have the three 2019 stretchers as reserve units should one fail or be broken.

Of the previous mentioned document on page 3 in paragraph 3 the stretchers have a 7 year expected service life under normal use conditions, and with periodic maintenance. Unfortunately we have exceed the 7 year mark on multiple stretchers, and none of our stretchers receive periodic maintenance, only receiving repairs when necessary. We have not had periodic/preventative maintenance due to cost. The request we are making does include preventative maintenance, repair maintenance, and battery replacement for the 12 new stretchers.

This decreases our request from \$1,003,366.52 to \$381,874.78.

RESOLUTION No: 21-12-901

RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE THE DONATION OF <u>UP TO</u> THREE HUNDRED AND EIGHTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$380,000.00) TO EACH OF THE EXISTING ELEVEN (11) FIRE DEPARTMENTS OPERATING IN ANDERSON COUNTY TO BE USED EXCLUSIVELY FOR THE PURCHASE OF ONE FIRE TRUCK, OR OTHER APPROVED FIREFIGHTING VEHICLE OR APPARATUS, IN AN EFFORT TO PROTECT THE HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELFARE OF ALL COUNTY CITIZENS.

WHEREAS, in April of 2006, the Anderson County Board of Commissioners adopted a Resolution providing funding on a rotating basis for the purchase of one (1) firetruck each year to a different county fire department on an eleven (11) year cycle; and

WHEREAS, with the final partial payment due to the Andersonville Volunteer Fire Department in the 2022/23 Fiscal Year Budget, all fire departments have been provided a firetruck or other approved vehicle to fully satisfy the County's obligation under the previous Resolution; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners realize the continued support of fire departments in our County is a matter of critical importance to the health, safety and welfare of our citizens, and now wishes to authorize a one-time donation of <u>up to</u> Three Hundred and Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$380,000.00) to each of the County's eleven (11) fire departments to be used exclusively for the purchase of one fire truck, or other approved firefighting vehicle or apparatus.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Anderson County Board of Commissioners meeting in regular session this 20th day of December 2021 that we wish to continue our support of the County's fire departments and our ongoing efforts and commitment to protect the health, safety and welfare of our citizens, we now hereby authorize the donation of up to Three Hundred and Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$380,000.00) to each of the County's eleven (11) fire departments to be used exclusively to purchase one firetruck, or other approved firefighting vehicle or apparatus under the following conditions:

SECTION 1: ELIGIBLE FIRE DEPARTMENTS AND ORGANIZATIONS

The following departments will be provided donations, as funding becomes available, in this specific order, unless variances are authorized by the Fire Commission:

- A) Briceville Volunteer Fire Department
- B) Oliver Springs Town Fire Department
- C) Clinton City Fire Department



- D) Rocky Top Fire Department
- E) Norris City Fire Department
- F) Claxton Volunteer Fire Department
- G) Marlow Volunteer Fire Department
- H) Oak Ridge City Fire Department
- I) Medford Volunteer Fire Department
- J) Anderson County Rescue Squad
- K) Andersonville Volunteer Fire Department

SECTION 2: OUALIFYING FIRETRUCKS OR VEHICLES

Each department or organization will be provided with donated funds authorized by the Anderson County Board of Commissioners in the amount of <u>up to</u> Three Hundred and Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$380,000.00) to purchase at least one qualifying vehicle per department meeting National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) standards and Insurance Services Office (ISO) requirements. Each firetruck, or firefighting vehicle or apparatus, must be approved by the Anderson County Fire Commission prior to purchase.

SECTION 3: RECEIVING OF DONATED FUNDS AND PURCHASE PROCESS

Each fire department will receive fifty percent (50%) or <u>up to</u> One Hundred and Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$190,000.00) when the approved vehicle is ordered and the County Finance Department receives an itemized invoice, or purchase contract, for the ordered vehicle. The remaining fifty percent (50%) or <u>up to</u> One Hundred and Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$190,000.00) will be donated when the department receives the vehicle, or delivery is imminent. The Anderson County Purchasing Department will have no responsibility to bid or process any vehicle order, and all required bidding, purchasing process, sales negotiations, selection of vehicles, equipment and manufactures or vendors, to include all aspects of vehicle purchase, shall be completed by the receiving fire department. All purchases by governmental entities must comply with applicable state law. The purchased vehicle will be owned by the respective purchasing fire department and shall not be titled in the name of Anderson County. The Anderson County Board of Commissioners may modify this process, or waive specific provisions, when needed and good cause is shown.

SECTION 4: LIABILITY FOR INCIDENTS INVOLVING VEHICLE PURCHASED WITH DONATED FUNDS FROM THE COUNTY.

Each department or organization will be individually responsible for all liability incurred as the result of purchasing, financing, ownership, use or operations of the vehicle purchased with donated funds from the County. Anderson County Government assumes no liability for the purchase, financing, operation, use or ownership of the vehicle. By accepting the donated funds from the County, each fire department agrees to release, hold harmless and fully indemnify Anderson County for all incidents and litigation that may, or may not occur, involving the vehicle purchased with donated funds from the County. If litigation occurs and the County is named as a party, the department receiving donated funds agrees to fully indemnify the County for all litigation



expenses, including damages awarded, court costs and reasonable attorney fees. Anderson County's only obligation under the terms of this Resolution is to provide the donated funds to purchase the vehicle when funding is available, and nothing more.

SECTION 5: VEHICLE MAINTENANCE

Each department or organization will be individually responsible for all maintenance for the vehicle purchased with donated funds from the County, including <u>all</u> repairs, damages, fuels, fluids, maintenance charges and warranty claims.

SECTION 6: ACCEPTANCE OF DONATED FUNDS INDICATES COMPLETE ACCEPTANCE OF THE TERMS EMBODDIED IN THIS RESOLUTION

All departments receiving donated funds under the terms of this Resolution agree to comply with all provisions embodied herein, and failure to comply may result in forfeiture of funds not yet received or a demand for reimbursement of donated funds, contingent upon approval of the Anderson County Board of Commissioners. Acceptance of donated funds will conclusively indicate the fire department's acceptance and consent to the terms of this Resolution.

SECTION 7: INSURANCE

Each department or organization receiving a vehicle under this Resolution will be responsible for obtaining insurance coverage on the vehicle. Insurance policies shall cover without limitation: liability, property loss, injury, death, dismemberment comprehensive, collision, uninsured motorist, medical payments, or other recognized forms of damages existing under Tennessee law in the minimal amounts of Three Hundred Thousand (\$300,000.00) Dollars per person and One Million (\$1,000,000.00) Dollars per occurrence.

SECTION 8: FIRE COMMISSION PARTICIPATION

Each department or organization receiving donated funds from the County agrees to attend and participate in monthly meetings of the Anderson County Fire Commission with no more than three (3) absences per calendar year. Request for waivers of this requirement shall be submitted to the Fire Commission and may be granted for good cause shown and demonstrated. Disputes arising from compliance with this agreement will first be redressed by the Fire Commission with subsequent ratification by the Board of Commissioners.

SECTION 9: RESPONSE TO EMERGENCIES

Each fire department or organization receiving donated funds from the County shall be required to respond to emergency medical calls as outlined by the Tennessee state guidelines when available. Nothing included in this Resolution shall mandate that a municipal fire department shall respond to incidents outside its jurisdiction when the municipal fire department is actively responding to calls within its own jurisdiction.



SECTION 10: MUTUAL AID RESPONSES

Each fire department or organization shall be required to fulfill its duties at all times under all standing mutual aid agreements and in compliance with all State Mutual Aid Guidelines, if available to respond. Nothing included in this Resolution shall mandate that a municipal fire department shall respond to incidents outside its jurisdiction when the fire department is actively responding to emergency calls within its own jurisdiction. Standby status does not relieve a municipal fire department from responding to emergency calls for service when requested under a valid mutual aid agreement.

SECTION 11: REQUIRED TRAINING PARTICIPATION

Each fire department and organization receiving a firetruck or other approved vehicle under the terms of this Resolution shall require all firefighters to adhere to Tennessee Code Annotated § 4-24-112 concerning minimum training requirements.

SECTION 12: PROHIBITION ON SUBSCRIPTION SERVICES OR RESPONSE CHARGES; SALE OR TRANSFER OF PURCHASED VEHICLE

Fire departments receiving a donation under the terms of this Resolution shall not charge for their services other than governmental taxing authority approved by the local county or municipal legislative body or Tennessee General Assembly. Fire departments who privately charge Anderson County citizens for emergency service responses or subscriptions are unable to receive a county donation for the purchase of a new fire truck, firefighting vehicle, or other vehicle apparatus; however, departments may charge for standby services for athletic events, highly dangerous or special needs requests unrelated to typical emergency calls, first responder and mutual aid responses when requested and compensation agreed to in advance. It is expected of the receiving the department that any vehicle purchased with donated funds from Anderson County will remain in use with the receiving department throughout the life of the vehicle; however, if a sale or transfer is contemplated during the lifetime of the vehicle while owned by the receiving department, waivers of this requirement will be considered by the Fire Commission for good cause shown. Departments failing to adhere to this process may jeopardize future donations from Anderson County Government.
