RESOLUTION TO TRANSFER FUNDS FROM GENERAL PURPOSE SCHOOL FUND TO SCHOOL FEDERAL PROJECTS FUND

WHEREAS, Federal Projects grants operate on a reimbursement basis and funds are requested from the State of Tennessee by Anderson County School District for expenditures on a monthly basis: and.

WHEREAS, the Federal Projects Fund has operated with a cash deficit at various times throughout the fiscal year due to a slow turn-around for reimbursements from the State of Tennessee; and.

WHEREAS, Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) consider a cash deficit in any fund to be a significant deficiency in internal control; and,

WHEREAS, Anderson County School District does not desire to operate any fund with a cash deficit.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Education of Anderson County School District, a school district in Tennessee, meeting in called session on this 9th day of November 2023, and by the County Commission of Anderson County, a county in Tennessee, meeting in called session on this 20th day of November, 2023, that:

SECTION 1. The General Purpose School Fund shall transfer \$ 1,125,000 to the School Federal Projects Fund on November 21, 2023.

SECTION 2. The \$1,125,000 transfer shall remain in the School Federal Projects Fund as a designated fund balance from the General Purpose School Fund and may be repaid at any time as noted in a resolution passed by the Board of Education and County Commission.

SECTION 3. This resolution will take effect on November 20, 2023. The Secretary of the Board of Education shall include this Resolution in the minutes of the Anderson County School District. The County Clerk shall include this Resolution in the minutes of Anderson County.

RE: North Charles G. Seivers Boulevard - Traffic Signalization Improvements

Mayor Frank:

As you are aware, the City of Clinton and Anderson County have had a long-standing cooperative relationship in the development of the three Industrial Parks located within the Clinton City Limits. This relationship began in the early 1960s, with the development of the Eagle Bend Industrial Park, continued in the late 1980s—early 1990s with the development of the Carden Farm Industrial Park, and most recently with the development of the Clinton / I-75 Industrial Park in the late 1990s—early 2000s. Anderson County has partnered with the City of Clinton in assisting with the costs of initial construction and infrastructure installation; including roadway and rail spur construction, bridge construction, and water, sewer, and natural gas facilities installation. We have also recently seen a need and opportunity to partner on other infrastructure and civic projects, which are mutually beneficial to all county residents.

We have previously discussed traffic flow and control issues in the North Charles G. Seivers Boulevard / I-75 Business District area; and more particularly the numerous requests from residents of the Hunter's Trail Subdivision (outside the City Limits) for a traffic signal installation at the N. CGS Blvd. / Doe Run Blvd. intersection. With additional commercial development in the area, and after several traffic studies - signal installations at this intersection, as well as the Hillvale Road / Tanner Lane (Walmart) intersection were approved by the Clinton City Council. These two new signals are funded with local funds, without State or Federal funding assistance. Because these two intersections also directly serve a significant number of county residents, we would like to request Anderson County's financial assistance with these installations.
