A RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING MR. LAWRENCE HAHN ON THE OCCASION OF HIS 90TH BIRTHDAY AND HIS LIFETIME OF DEDICATION TO THE BOYS AND GIRLS CLUB OF OAK RIDGE

WHEREAS in 1953, as a sophomore at East Tennessee State University, Lawrence Hahn began working at the Johnson City Boys Club. And, in 1958, he was named the first executive director of the Boys Club of Oak Ridge – the youngest Boys Club executive director in the country – and, upon his retirement in August 2009, Mr. Hahn was viewed as the longest serving paid executive in the history of the Boys and Girls Clubs of America; and

WHEREAS the Oak Ridge club started in an approximately 1,200-square-foot abandoned and dilapidated wooden structure. But through Mr. Lawrence Hahn's enthusiasm and leadership, he built a productive network of volunteers and influential benefactors and oversaw the construction of modern club facilities with a gymnasium, learning center, and four athletic fields. Most importantly, Mr. Lawrence Hahn's commitment and passion for the Boys and Girls Clubs' programs positively affected generations of youth and their families; and

WHEREAS Mr. Lawrence Hahn and his wife, Barbara, raised three children of their own – David, James, and Eva – while he continually exceeded his professional obligations and often was the only father figure that many boys and girls ever had in their lives. He always made sure the club's participants were nourished and receiving many of the positive life experiences that more fortunate families provided for their children; and

WHEREAS in 1982, Mr. Lawrence Hahn founded the club's Alumni Association, which has been recognized as one of the largest and most active alumni associations in the nation, providing hundreds of thousands of dollars and thousands of service hours to support the work of the Oak Ridge Boys and Girls Club. Since his retirement, Mr. Lawrence Hahn has continued to serve as a program volunteer and consultant and has been appointed by the club's Board of Directors as Executive Director Emeritus, and, in recognition of his lifelong commitment to the organization, the club has been named in his honor; and

WHEREAS Mr. Lawrence Hahn has been honored nationally by the Boys and Girls Clubs of America, and he has received several local community service awards, including the Rotary Vocational Service Award, the Sertoma Service to Mankind Award, the Fraternal Order of Eagles Service Award, the East Tennessee Chapter of the National Football League Foundation and Hall of Fame Distinguished Service Award, the Rotary Club Paul Harris Fellow, and the Outstanding Tennessean Award, presented by Governor Lamar Alexander.

NOW, *THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED*, meeting in regular session on Monday, July 15, 2024, that we, the Anderson County Board of Commissioners, and County Mayor Terry Frank do hereby recognize Mr. Lawrence Hahn for the occasion of his 90th birthday this month. In so doing, we also humbly honor Mr. Lawrence Hahn for his passion and commitment and the positive and lasting impacts he has had on countless children and generations of families in Oak Ridge and throughout Anderson County.







A rezoning request was considered for recommendation to the county commission from an A-2 District to a C-1 District for property located at the intersection of Sinking Springs Road and Bland Road. The property is contiguous with an adjoining commercial district toward North Charles Seviers Boulevard (State Route 61). Staff stated the general area is a predominately rural residential and agricultural. The rezoning of the property would extend the commercial district along Sinking Springs Road. Following discussion, a motion was made by Tim Isbel and seconded by Tony Gregg to recommend to the county commission approval of the rezoning request. The motion passed unanimously.

REVIEW STARDUST RIDGE, LLC CAMPGROUND REVISED SITE PLAN, TAX MAP 03. PARCEL 12.05

A site plan was submitted for a proposed campground off Stardust Lane within an A-1 District. The campground has been revised from the original design when a previous site plan was approved. There were some residents that were present to voice some concerns they had about the project. The site plan has been reviewed and is a better design than the original proposal. Following discussion, a motion was made by Tony Gregg and seconded by Harold Edwards to recommend approval of the site plan contingent upon the sign location and the setbacks. Anderson County ADA Oversight Committee Minutes for July 1, 2024

Item 1) Roger told the committee that that the owner of Christy Signs Unlimited went with Roger to see how many offices in the courthouse needed raised print and Braille with paper inserts for sighted people to know what the room is. Roger said that each sign cost \$175, but ordering them in bulk would cost the county less per sign. He said he would like to start on the first floor to see if we liked them. If so, he would order more signs for the second and third floors.

Louise suggested that it would be ideal to have the Braille and raised print signs on the bottom of the sign instead of the top of the signs like we have now on our signs. This will make it easier to meet ADA compliance regulations than what we have now. Roger said they will be mounted at 48 inches from the floor to the lower edge of the Braille and raised print. Marian Wildgruber, who is blind suggested that we have the raised print in another color than the signs will be for people with low vision like we have now.

Roger said that he will then order signs for the Jolley Building, but Louise said recently she went to the Jolley Building and saw that they had removed the insert paper detailing what the offices are and that have just had the Braille and raised print signs. Louise suggested that Roger talk to someone, specifically Jay Yeager whose office is at that building to ask him why they removed the paper insert sign before he orders more signs. The ADA regulations does not require the paper inserts. The courthouse has some signs over the door identifying the offices/departments, but not all rooms have overhead signs.

Item 2) Lousie asked Roger and Commissioner Steve Verran to speak to Scott Nation, the new Veterans Administrator, to see if he would ask their veterans if they would like to be on the county's ADA Oversight Committee. Steve said he would do so the veterans meeting at 6:00pm that evening.

Item 3) We talked about the step climber, which will allow people who use walkers or wheelchairs or even canes who have a hard problem going down stairs in an emergency. Louise asked that it be part of the spreadsheet for TDOT to see that we spent ADA funds on emergency preparedness. We did this last year, but it was not on TDOT's report last year. Item 4) Louise asked Roger if he would ask Andrew to send a spreadsheet of what we spent the past three years to Marian, or at least the total. Marian said that the spreadsheet would be fine.

Item 5) Louise asked Roger if he had the time to write up his duties for his department for Buildings and Grounds for the county's website. Now the Buildings and Grounds department just shows his duties for ADA. But there is another department called Disability Services on the county's website. He said there are a huge list of what he does. Louise will suggest that he look at websites for Elections, EMS, and Finance Departments that have a categorized what they do in separate tabs or links as soon as I finish these minutes.

Item 6) Louise said she went to the National ADA Symposium in Minneapolis, Minnesota. At one of the sessions, she met the TDOT ADA Coordinator, Shanna Chevalier. Louise said she lived in Oak Ridge. Shanna said that she her husband are looking to find a house in Oak Ridge. Shanna will still be TDOT's ADA Coordinator. Louise asked her if she would like to be on the Anderson County ADA committee. Shanna said, "Yes."

When Louise got back home, she emailed Mayor Frank that Shanna said that she would like to be on the ADA committee to which Mayor Frank said that she would be a good idea for Shanna to be on the ADA committee.

Louise forgot to tell Shanna that Oak Ridge is in Anderson and Roane counties. If Shanna found a house in Roane County, she could not be on the ADA committee. However, the members of the ADA committee agreed that if Shanna bought a house in Roane County that we would welcome her to be an advisor for our committee.

Item 7) Recently Louise got an email from the Tennessee Disability Coalition saying "on April 24, 2024, the Department of Justice (DOJ) published a final rule under Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) to ensure the accessibility of web content and mobile applications (apps) for people with disabilities. This final rule clarifies the obligations of state and local governments to make their websites and mobile apps accessible to people with disabilities."

That led to discussion that Louise had sent the members of the committee several of the power points that Louise took at the ADA Symposium in Minneapolis. The slides did not describe what the presenter said. That would really not be good for Marian because she would not be able to see the slides. To which Marian said, that she has an app called "Be My Eyes" that describes all the slides that Louise sent. Louise asked how much the app cost, to which Marian said, "It is free." All the ADA committee members immediately wrote Be My Eyes down. Louise will share all this information to Stephanie Wells.

Item 8) Other ADA concerns: Marian suggested that the Jolley Building should have a push button door opener. It does have not it. Other county owned buildings that have push button door openers are the Larry Dickens building and the General Sessions Court 2 in Oak Ridge. Roger said that he knows that the Circuit Court in the courthouse definitely needs a push button door opener. Louise said we may have to this for the restroom doors also, if we cannot find a workman to loosen the closers on courthouse's unisex doors.
